## Village Hall (Penkhull Village Hall Community Trust

There are 15 different regular classes, the latest being Dizzy Heights youth club.

## Development of St.Peter's Way on the old school site

A plaque was unveiled at the former school housing development on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> March by the former Head Master, Don Titley, and the deputy Head Mistress, Elizabeth Leslie. They commented: "Thank you for all the thought and planning, the unveiling of the St.Peters rock and plaque meant a lot to us".

There were around 50 people in attendance including former pupils, residents and past and present PRA members.

During the site's development Chris Preece acted as coordinator between the site management and the residents' association and developed a good rapport with Ben Tunstall, the site manager.

The memorial stone and plaque idea came out of the PRA committee and Dean Richardson, after much work, arranged for council to provide a stone.

The negotiation to site the stone, the historical research, proving the provenance, wording and mounting the plaque and organising the unveiling were all undertaken by members of the PRA committee.

Martin Wakefield sourced and provided the plaque.

## A New Notice Board for the Village

Some of you will have noticed that we now have a new notice board on the wall of the Penkhull Christian Fellowship (now called Light Church), at the junction of Newcastle Lane and St Thomas' Place. Many thanks to Mike Allen for organising this out of the PRA budget, to everyone who helped to install it and to Terry Hitchen who will be the go-to person to get notices posted up.

## **Buildings and Planning**

#### **Penkhull Farm Development**

Many people will have noticed that the housing development of the Penkhull Farm site has not restarted. Apparently there are still many issues for the Council to deal with in regards to planning permission as the Farm house and barn are listed buildings, even though they have been derelict for over 30 years and are clearly crumbling. Neighbours' concerns have been taken into account and the consultation stage has been complete for some months now.

There have been concerns that the Excel Development are no longer properly registered with Companies House, but these have now been assuaged by council officer Tom Coates and the development should go ahead as planned, at some stage.

#### **Donald Bates Home**

The owners of the former Donald Bates home, on the corner of Garden St and Manor Court Street, have agreed with our Councilor Sara Hill, to consider selling the site on now for development.

## Project Star: (Grindley Hill Multi-Storey Car Park along Hilton Road)

The work on site is almost complete, with the car park due to open officially on 29 April 2024. The ribbon cutting ceremony will take place on 24 April. Currently, the road surfacing of the site is taking place, and the blue fencing is erected.

Once this new car park is up and running the Royal Infirmary site will be free to be developed for housing.

## Penkhull Infants/ Penkhull Education Centre (corner of Greatbatch Avenue and St Thomas' Place)

Unfortunately there has been no interest in anyone taking on this building. The Penkhull Christian Fellowship did show an interest at one point, but it transpires that an estimate for refurbishment would be of the order of £7m, which is, of course, off-putting for anyone.

When I was on the Willows School Board, ten years ago, the original council plan was to knock it all down. And to this end all the internal wood paneling was sold off, leaving the place in a mess. Then it was decided to make it a listed building.

The Penkhull Service station and parents of children at the Willows school use the grounds for parking and have reported significant pot holes occurring now on the site.

#### The Croft


As of 18 months ago the Croft has still not been fully ratified as part of the conservation area of Penkhull. See the map over the page. The PRA remains vigilant.

- Car parking issues around the Willows School at pick-up and drop-off times
- Grit bin and litter bin placements around the village
- Where to place a mobile phone mast in Penkhull
- This list changes all the time
